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## MISSION STATEMENT

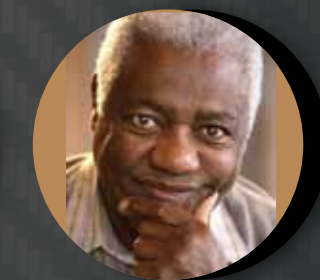

The Harold & Carole Pump Foundation (H&CPF) honors a beloved father who lost his battle with cancer in 2000 and a loving mother who passed away in 2012. Using their unique relationship-building talents and skills, their sons Dana and David Pump, working with Northridge Hospital Foundation, have raised more than \$6 million for the Carole Pump Women’s Center, the Harold and Carole Pump Department of Radiation Oncology, and the Thomas and Dorothy Leavey Cancer Center at Dignity Health Northridge Hospital Medical Center and other non-profit community charities.

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### EDUCATION AND FREE SCREENINGS

Educating the community about cancer prevention and early detection is vital to the health of our residents. With free education and cancer screenings, lives can be saved with early detection. In 2014, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation Outreach Program attended 118 community events and educated more than 7,372 people on cancer awareness. Education was provided in both English and Spanish.

Thanks to the generosity of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation, the Carole Pump Women’s Center hosted 12 FREE health fairs for the uninsured in our community. “Reaching Out Health Fairs” attract hundreds of people who receive free breast evaluations and screenings. Since prevention is key, attendees also learn how to decrease their chances of a cancer diagnosis. In 2014, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation provided 811 people with the following FREE health screenings:

- 704 Mammograms
- 13 Ultrasound Needle Placement
- 4 Diagnostic Mammograms
- 13 Biopsies
- 35 Ultrasounds
- 42 Follow-up Consultations

### FAMILY PLAN – PATIENT NAVIGATOR

Finding compassionate support is important, especially for new patients who are overwhelmed with a cancer diagnosis. A patient navigator serves as a personal guide who meets with inpatients and outpatients one-on-one to better acquaint them with the Carole Pump Women’s Center, the Harold and Carole Pump Department of Radiation Oncology and the Leavey Cancer Center. Through the generous support of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation, patients can rely on their Navigator for compassionate support, encouragement and education to ensure they have every available resource to make informed decisions regarding treatment, options and symptom management.

### FAMILY PLAN – SUPPORT, COMFORT AND HOME HEALTH

The Family Plan Fund assists patients and their families with payment for services or equipment needs. Patients who are hospitalized or at home with a cancer diagnosis face many difficult hours filled with painful treatments, unpleasant side effects, invasive tests, and much uncertainty. This is interspersed with periods of boredom, depression and fatigue – making it a very difficult time for patients and their families.

In 2014, the H&CPF provided cancer patients with over 1,599 hours of home healthcare and one-on-one support.

The 24 hours/week care has been enormously helpful in our efforts to keep my mother at home in the comfort of her own bed and her familiar surroundings. The people they have sent into my mother’s home have been competent and kind. The three weeks you approved for her has given us enough time to make arrangements for her continuing care without having to function in panic. Thank you.*

*“I just wanted to write you because it is important to Jean-Paul and myself that you know how immensely helpful your transportation service has been.*

*He was diagnosed with mycosis fungoides and sezary syndrome (skin and blood cancer) in January of 2013. There is no cure for this kind of cancer so he will need some kind of treatment his entire life. For many months, I was unaware this service was available so I would be the one to take time off of work to take my husband to his appointments and chemotherapy. As it is a uniquely stressful situation to become a caregiver for someone you love, it is an additional challenge to also deal with the time off from work.*

*Once we found out this transportation service was available, both my husband and I were greatly relieved. Before this, my husband would try to drive himself to his appointments, even when he probably should not be driving at all. He was trying desperately to be self-sufficient to help me with the burden of the appointments. Once we found out about the service, he has no issue whatsoever with utilizing the service.*

### FAMILY PLAN – TRANSPORTATION TO THOSE IN NEED

For those cancer patients with no means of travel, the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation has budgeted a portion of their funding to provide transportation to and from the hospital for treatment and tests. This past year the Foundation provided 1,101 trips. This service continues to be a tremendous benefit for those in need.

### EQUIPMENT – RETROFIT OF RADIATION/ONCOLOGY CHILLER AND LEIPZIG APPLICATION SYSTEM

Linear Accelerators require chiller units to cool the machine during delivery of radiation. Chillers provide a cooling mechanism by pumping cool water through the machine. Due to the sensitive nature of the Linear Accelerator, chillers must be able to maintain a constant temperature. A need to retrofit the chiller to provide high ambient temperature surface up to 110 degrees was needed and accomplished through the funding of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation.

Also, through the support of the Harold & Carole Pump Foundation, a Leipzig applicator system was purchased to treat skin and other type cancers. This device has led to more efficient use of staff time, greater patient satisfaction, better clinical outcomes and fewer side effects for patients.
